



Dear International Students,

This correspondence contains information regarding arrivals, accommodations and transportation to JFOU from Narita airport.

- Immigration/Customs: Upon arrival, you will first need to go through customs and immigration. Please make sure you do not pack your passport, visa, and other documents in your checked baggage. You will need them to go through immigration before you pick up your checked baggage. At immigration, you will be issued a government ID card for your time in Japan. On any forms you need to fill out, please just write your local address in Japan as: J. F. Oberlin University, Office of International Programs. 3758 Tokiwa-machi, Machida-shi, Tokyo 194-0294. The telephone number is 042-797-5419.
 - Arrival Pick-up: JFOU staff and students will provide a pick-up service at Narita Airport for students on **March 26 (12:00~18:00)**.
 - Airport Pickup:
To find JFOU staff and students, please see the Narita Airport Layout for meeting point (“[Where to meet up at Narita airport](#)”). They will take you to the hotel where you are staying a night of **March 26**. They will take you to the bus JFOU provided headed toward the JFOU campus in the morning of **March 27**.

- >>>>After you exit from customs, please exchange money if you have not already done it in your home country. The exchange rate is usually better in Japan. We recommend that you would exchange approximately \$400.
- Independent Arrivals not expecting airport pick-up: For the independent arrivals who are living in JFOU dorms but do not expect airport pickup, you must be at **JFOU Machida campus, Meimei-kan building 2F by 11:45 on March 27**: <http://www.obirin.ac.jp/en/access/index.html>.
There is a free school bus shuttle from the north exit of Fuchinobe Station on the JR Yokohama Line.
